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MSc Psychology

- MSc confers eligibility of graduate basis for chartered membership of the BPS (GBC)
- In order to be eligible for GBC students must gain an overall pass mark of at least 50% and must complete the final level empirical psychology project.
- No compensation is allowed.

Do I need BPS accreditation?

- Needed for entry to ALL postgraduate professional training courses in Psychology
 - Health Psychology
 - Clinical Psychology
 - Educational Psychology
 - Occupational Psychology
- Also needed for entry onto many academic postgraduate M level courses in Psychology
- Not necessarily needed for a PhD in Psychology.....
 - But you would need a background in empirical research

Structure MSc

- Consists of 8 M level modules
 - Some of these are shared with the other MSc programmes
- FT study mode = 1 year of study
- PT study model = 2 years of study
- Maximum completion time = 5 years

Cognitive and Social Aspects of Development

(Developmental Psychology I)

- **Cohorts:** MSc Psychology and MRes Developmental Psychology
- **Part of BPS Syllabus:** Developmental Psychology
- **Content:**
 - cognitive developmental
 - development of reasoning, working memory and executive functioning
 - attachment
 - gender role development, culture and socialisation
- **Assessment:** 100% Coursework: One 300-word research summary (20%) and one 2000-word essay (80%)

Social Psychology

- **Cohorts:** MSc Psychology
- **Part of BPS Syllabus:** Social Psychology
- **Structure:** Student-led seminars, students will present findings from indicative readings, lead discussions and take an active role in sessions covering:
 - Attitudes
 - Prejudice
 - Intergroup dynamics and leadership
 - Social Influence
 - Communication
 - Attraction
- **Assessment:** Presentation (Pass/Fail) and Exam (100%): Essay questions

Introduction to Cognitive Neuroscience

- **Cohorts:** MSc Psychology and MSc Cognitive Neuroscience
- **Part of BPS Syllabus:** Biological Psychology and Cognitive Psychology
- **Content:**
 - Neuroscience of vision and attention
 - Executive Functions – planning & reasoning
 - Language
 - Learning and Memory
 - Emotions
- **Assessment:** Exam (100%): 2 essay questions, one focusing on cognitive aspects and one focusing on biological aspects

Experimental Method & Statistics for Psychology

- **Cohorts:** All taught PG students
- **Part of BPS Syllabus:** Research Design (quantitative methods) and Cognitive Psychology
- **Content:**
 - Analysis of Variance and Analysis of Covariance
 - Data handling
 - Data reduction: Factor Analysis/reliability
 - Regression and Logistic regression
- **Assessment:** Coursework (100%): A grant report and short answer questions

Intelligence and Individual Differences

(Theory and Methods in Psychology I)

- **Cohorts:** MSc Psychology and MRes Developmental Psychology
- **BPS syllabus:** Individual differences, Cognitive psychology, Research design (qualitative and quantitative methods)
- **Content:**
 - Narrative interviewing and Interpretative and Phenomenological Analysis of social data
 - Ethnicity and analysing verbal data
 - Psychometrics, Intelligence and psychological testing
 - Cognitive Style and Questionnaires in Socio-Cognitive Psychopathology
- **Assessment:** Coursework (100%): 1 seminar presentation (P/F) and 1,500-word essay (100%).

Personality and Psychological Disorders

(Theory and Methods in Psychology II)

- **Cohorts:** MSc Psychology
- **BPS Syllabus:** Individual differences, Research design (quantitative methods)
- **Content:**
 - Personality, including experimental methods and theoretical approaches
 - Mood & its measurement
 - Theory & research methods in emotional processing and facial expression
 - Mental health and psychological disorders
 - Cultural variations in behavior & experience
 - Issues of gender and ethnicity
- **Assessment:** Coursework (100%): 3,000-word essay

Research Design Skills and Research Based dissertation

- **Cohorts:** All taught PG students
- **BPS syllabus:** Practical component

- **Research design skills:**
 - Literature reviews, library skills, bibliographic skills
 - Ethical practices and procedures
 - Presentation skills
 - **Assessment :** Coursework (100%): Literature review and presentation (pass/fail) on the topic of the research-based dissertation.

- **Research based dissertation**
 - Individual tutorials with project
 - **Assessment:** Coursework (100%): The dissertation is a 10,000 word piece reporting an original empirical study

Entry Requirements

You must normally possess the following qualifications:

- an upper second-class or first-class honours degree awarded by a recognised institution of higher education in the UK or overseas **AND**
- 60 CATS credits in Psychology (including statistics and research methods). You must normally have achieved an average of 60% in these 60 credits **AND**
- English as your first language, or GCSE or O-level English Language, or a TOEFL score of at least 600 (paper based) or 100 (internet based), or an IELTS score of 7.0, or equivalent evidence of proficiency in English.

Fees etc.

- EU FT = £5,350
- EU PT = £2,730
- International FT = £11,140
- 10% discount on fees if you study on the SQC and MSc in consecutive years

 - **Must apply soon**
- **John Henry Brookes Scholarship:**
 - £1,000 - £3,000 awards
 - **Must be FT in Health and Life Sciences Faculty**
